


Text-Dependent Comprehension Questions for Higher-Order Thinking

- Level 3 questions require students to search for clues/evidence to prove their implied and inferred answers.
- Level 4 questions require students to determine the author's purpose and the structure and organization of the text.

Vocabulary	Reread and look for clues to help you define the unfamiliar word. Can you find a synonym, definition, text clues, or picture clues?	
Find It! Level 1 Comprehension	The answers are right in the text. Reread to locate facts and details to answer the questions.	
Look Closer! Level 2 Comprehension	The answers are in the text. When you reread , look in more than one place to find them.	
Prove It! Level 3 Comprehension	You'll have to be a detective when you reread . You won't find the exact answers to these questions, but you will find clues and evidence to support your inferences and conclusions.	
Take It Apart! Level 4 Comprehension EPARES	As you reread , ask yourself, "How did the author organize the information? Why did she/he write the book?"
